

PRIMROSEHILL EQUESTRIAN RISK ASSESSMENT 10/04/2022

Hazard – Horse Spooking (Severity 1/5, Likelihood 2/5)

Current Measures in Place: only one booking on the course at a time (max 4 horses). Daily check to ensure no foreign Items on the course.

Risk Rating: 3

Hazard – Rider Falls From Horse (Severity 2/5, Likelihood 2/5)

Current Measure in Place: Jumps and Ground are checked daily. Continual process of removing stones and filly holes on the course when they are identified. Any jumps which are not suitable for jumping on the day are closed – the flags are crossed in front of the jump. The most popular jumps have grit on the take-off and landings which is topped up as and when required. Jumps meet current British Eventing safety standards as they built by a BE accredited course designer, Jamie Innes, who also advises on safety. There is a notice at the registration point with 3 words that will direct an ambulance to xc field.

Before going up to the Jumps Field Rider must sign disclaimer agreeing to:

- 1) Wear protective clothing – a hat and body protector to current standards
- 2) Keep dogs on lead
- 3) Walk the course on foot or horseback to familiarise themselves with the ground conditions
- 4) Inspect each jump to ensure that it is suitable for them

Risk Rating: 5

Hazard – Loose horse (Severity 2/5, Likelihood 2/5)

Current Measures in Place: Rider must be accompanied by an adult with a mobile phone. Minimum of 2 people on the course at all times.

Risk Rating: 5

Hazard – Spectator is Hurt (Severity 2/5, Likelihood 1/5)

Current Measures in Place: Spectator must stand a minimum of 3m away from jump being used.

Risk Rating: 3

Severity: 5 = fatality, 4 = severe, 3 = lost time, 2 = minor, 1 = no injury

Likelihood: 5 = certain, 4 = very likely, 3 = likely, 2 = unlikely, 1 = remote

Risk Rating: 1-5 = low, 6-12 = medium, 13-25 = high
